Local Task Forces and Interagency Coordinating Councils

A Consent Agreement on the Right to Education was signed in 1972 as part of the resolution of the PARC v. Commonwealth of PA case. It established a state task force and 29 local task forces (one in each intermediate unit). The goal of the task forces is to support parents through training, resource sharing, and networking so that they can work with their school or Local Education Agency (LEA) in a positive, proactive manner. It is a parent/family network group for families of a child with a disability.
