We recognize that IEP documents are fluid documents and issues arise throughout the school year so we thought this might be helpful to families. We are not attorneys, but we do speak the language of special educators and are available to listen and help you navigate the special education process. Featured Artificial Intelligence (AI)


In our ongoing AI feature, we thought it might be helpful to highlight AI for IEPs and parents. AI is like a 'computer brain' that learns as more information is provided to it. Information related to IEPs has been analyzed by AI so that it can provide translations of technical IEP jargon, propose goals, and even suggest questions to ask at the IEP meetings. **One caution**: Don't provide your child's personal, identifiable information. AI's computer brain may take that sensitive data and use it elsewhere. Here are a few AI for IEPs and parents that you might want to check out.

Trees Assistive Technology Device Center Open Lab Days

We maintain an Assistive Technology (AT) Device Center for use by students and families. AT is any item, piece of equipment, software or product system that is used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities (IDEA, 2004). AT can range from low technology (such as a pencil grip) to high technology (speech recognition software). This semester, the AT Device Center will host Open Lab Days on Wednesdays from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm. The Device Center will be open to the public without an appointment. Visitors can explore a variety of AT, including adapted computer



equipment, communication devices, and switch-friendly apps and toys. Staff will be available to answer questions; however, individualized support is dependent on the number of participants. Appointments are also available. Come to RMU, Patrick Henry 333 and check out the various devices.
